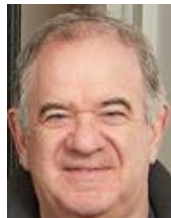

Thank you to Rabbi Yaakov Glasman who brings much *nachas* to our Shule. Not only is he a wonderful rabbi and very much loved, but he is also a true mensch. A great representative for our Shule. - In January, Avraham Yee, at only 21 years, became the seventh choirmaster in our 152 year history. The choir has gone from strength to strength. As well as the joy it brings us every Shabbat morning, in the summer months, we hold Kabbalat Shabbat services at Caulfield Park and once a month at Emmy Monash Aged Care for delighted and appreciative residents and visitors
- We published a Shabbat Song Book (with the assistance of Chazzan Brett Kaye) for Shabbas mornings containing the main Shabbat tunes, enabling members and guests to engage joyously in our choral services
- A multi-faith and multi-cultural Shabbat service was initiated
- Our Shule become the first Melbourne Shule to adopt an Environmental Protection and Climate Action policy in collaboration with the Jewish Climate Network
- A Shule gardening Bee was created to beautify our gardens to complement our already magnificent heritage building and its interiors.

Earlier this year, we were proud to be part of Ballarat Shule's re-dedication ceremony, with our beloved Rabbi Hillel Nagel leading the service and Avraham Yee conducting the St Kilda choir at the service. We have enjoyed a very long, strong and close relationship with Ballarat Shule.

Another highlight this year for me was unexpectedly stumbling across an old desk of Sir John Monash, purchasing and donating it to the Shule, becoming Rabbi Glasman's new desk.

We are blessed to have a strong mix of congregants that are both 'newer' members as well as multi-generational members, each equally important to us, valued and part of our extended family.

We look forward to seeing you at Shule on Yomtov, hearing about or being part of your celebrations during the year, but also being there for you during your times of need.

Chief Executive Officer's Report



After more than a decade in the Shule I retired from this position at the end of March 2022. I was honoured to be invited to return in an interim role in mid-November while a selection committee undertook a search for a new General Manager.

During the past 8 months I have managed the organisation, initially full-time until February and then progressively reducing to four days a week and since July, to now three days a week.

The operational highlights during the year were:

- Repair of perimeter wall brickwork.
- Relaunch of the successful Thursday Lunch Club in 2023, which now sees around 35-40 each session.
- Shiurim which had gone online during COVID during 2020-2 have moved to a hybrid face-to-face and online presence.
- Launch of a Cultural Fund which has received tax-deductible status. In January 2023, the Cultural Fund directors met and conceived of a first project which brought in around \$15,000.
- \$10,000 donation from Greg Rosshandler towards the cost of new sukkah. This is part of a capital works project, supported by the State government with a \$100,000 grant, to also refloor the ASC annexe and repair external brickwork to the ASC walls.
- Multicultural service and Kiddush
- Open House Melbourne
- Award of a \$300,000 Federal Government grant to refurbish the DC and Main Shule toilets.
- Commission of the installation of a donor board to acknowledge 150th anniversary donors.
- Commission of a plaque to accompany the pastel painting of Rabbi Danglow, purchased by the Cultural Fund in August 2022.
- Refurbishment of the Danglow Centre corridors
- New emergency locks in the two sides of the upstairs ladies gallery and the downstairs main doors at the back in accordance with CSG.

Thanks go to **David Marlow** who was employed as Executive Director for the first 8 months of the year and continues to volunteer for the Shule and represents the Shule on the Climate Change Policy.

I would like to thank the following for their critical contributions to making St Kilda Shule such an integral part of the Melbourne Jewish community:

- President **Janice Iloni-Furstenberg**, Vice President **Silviu Itescu**, Treasurer **Jay Greenberg** and the Board of Management.
- **Rabbi Yaakov Glasman AM** for his guidance and spiritual leadership.
- Our Ministerial team, which includes our assistant **Rabbi Hillel Nagel** and **Chazzan Brett Kaye**, widely recognised in the community as being the A-team of Melbourne's Shules.

Thanks go to **Lorette Brown** and **Garry Fabian OAM** who have assisted with *Shabbat Shalom* articles, office volunteers **John Karp** (who comes every Monday and Wednesday afternoon), **Abby Levy** (who was coming every Wednesday afternoon until I moved to part-time) and **Uri Rosenberg** (who attends every Monday morning). **John Slutzkin**, **Len Levy OAM** and **Paul Topol** have been instrumental in assisting with weekday and Shabbat/Yom Tov services. **Danny Goldsmith** and **Noel Levin OAM** continue to organise the weekly volunteer security roster, a role that they have done for well over a decade.

I thank **my wife Eve** who has had to put up with my "mid-life crisis" while I try working in other fields and organisations. We look forward to attending a grandson's Bar Mitzvah in Israel, just before Rosh Hashanah but I will be back in time to lead Adele Southwick Centre parallel services over Kol Nidrei and Yom Kippur.

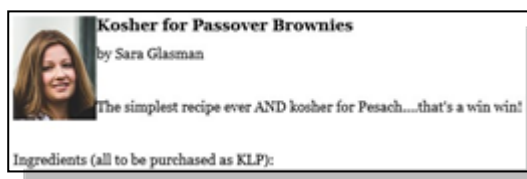

Assistant Minister's Report



As I look back over the past year, I think about all the amazing activities, events and classes that the Shule has offered. I have been fortunate to be part of our very successful Bar and Bat Mitzvah programme, exciting family events, engaging Torah classes

and adult education, and numerous St Kilda shule *simchas*. I feel very privileged to work with such an amazing team – supporting Rabbi Glasman, singing with the choir, working with the President, Board, Chazzan, Choirmaster, CEO, office staff and the amazing team of volunteers - and of course, being part of our warm and vibrant *kehillah*.

I really enjoy running the Bar Mitzvah programme with Rabbi Glasman and working with Tali Koth and our Bat Mitzvah programme. As a Shule, we should be very proud of the continued success of our programmes with growing numbers and an amazing variety of educational and social experiences.



Our classes and activities give us the opportunity to connect with the Shule's youth and hopefully build long-lasting relationships as participants grow into young adults and enter the world as proud and knowledgeable members of the Jewish community. A central theme of the curriculum is about giving to society, teaching participants about the role of a young Jewish adult in this world and the contribution that each can make. Some of the engaging activities include volunteering at a soup kitchen, learning about Melbourne's charitable organisations, participating in the 'Remember Me' course which teaches the Holocaust, genocide and human behaviour; and our weekly discussions on contemporary Jewish thought.

A highlight of my week at Shule is our *Talmud for Everyone* class. This type of study allows us

to gain a deeper insight into our laws and traditions. By analysing the sources, asking questions, arguing our points and sharing ideas, we end up learning new things and have a better understanding of Jewish laws and traditions and their purpose. We are able to take this ancient wisdom and make it relevant to our daily work and family lives. Some of the topics we covered this year included the Jewish court system, origins of the siddur, conversions, mysticism, and science in Halachah.



Another fond memory from the past year occurred in March when our Shule was very honoured to be part of an historic service at Ballarat Hebrew Congregation in honour of their rededication following an extensive renovation. Our Shule has had a long association with Ballarat and it was a great privilege to lead the afternoon service together with special prayers and songs together with our very own St Kilda Shule choir, led by Choirmaster Avraham Yee. Over 100 guests from the Ballarat community as well as many visitors from Melbourne and beyond enjoyed this special event.



Above all, being part of a wonderful community gives us a sense of purpose and belonging. Aside from our wonderful Shabbat, Yom Tov and daily services, St Kilda Shule offers so many events, activities and classes – there is something for everyone.

Treasurer's Report



Dear valued members and seat holders,

Despite a challenging economic environment, I am pleased to report that the Shule's financial position remains robust.

Despite an inflationary environment, with the assistance and generosity of our growing membership base, for the 12 month period ending 31 March 2023, the Shule reported a small deficit of \$21,177. This result aligned to our conservatively planned budget which forecast a breakeven result.

In 2023, total revenue grew marginally by 6.85% compared to the prior financial year, mostly driven by Offerings, Membership Income and Seat Income. As well as improvement in operating income, the Shule derived additional passive income of \$33,114 as a result of a successful implementation of investment strategy in respect to our capital reserve. We expect this yield will improve throughout the 2024 financial year, as a result of the increased interest rate environment.

Despite healthy growth in income, the Shule continues to face significant cost pressures most notably Repairs & Maintenance (+52.47%), and overall increase in event and operating expenditure, reflective of increased community activity following the forced covid hibernation.

In response to increasing cost pressures, the Shule has instituted price increase to membership and seat fees, in line with CPI. Membership fees have risen from \$395 to \$425 per annum, whilst seat fees have risen broadly by an amount that overall should not exceed 8%. As we stress every year, membership and seat rental fees are the financial lifeblood of our Shule, and we very much appreciate your understanding and support on this matter.

Upon review of our published financial statements, you'll note that at 31 March 23, our balance sheet is strong, and has improved in comparison to the 2022 financial year. The Shule's total asset position has remained stable at \$10.32M, (comprised mostly of Land & Buildings valued at \$9M). The organisation is formally debt free, and total liabilities have fallen by approximately \$109,000, due to the reallocation of government support income to be allocated to capital improvements. In the period, net assets from remained materially stable at \$9,965,659.

Looking ahead to the 2024 financial year, we have prepared a conservative budget which anticipates a small operating loss to reflect ongoing inflationary pressures, as well as provision for the

board's enthusiasm to broaden membership activity and community engagement.

During the 2024 financial year, the Shule intends to embark on some significant capital investment projects. These include:

- Renovation of all bathroom facilities in the Shule and Danglow Centre buildings
- Restoration of the Adele Southwick Centre annex and associated sukkah
- Playground installation, next to the annex
- Repair to the brick wall surrounding the premises



- Restoration of the front and side Shule doors, possibly with a federal government grant

Finally, as you would be aware, the board are currently investing in a detailed administrative restructure of the office in order to better support the Shule's facilities, programmes, ministerial staff and members. As part of this restructure, we soon expect to welcome a new administrative leadership. The board very much looks forward to successfully implementing this new restructure and working closely with the new team to deliver the strategic direction of Janice and the board.

The weekly *Shabbat Shalom* is published both in print edition and online, boasting a more-than 1550 circulation. It is posted out each week to the older members who do not have an email address. The newsletter continues to be popular both with our own membership and the wider Jewish community (approx. cost \$8000) and its circulation has been maintained, particularly in the electronic version. The Trustees are very grateful for the continued support of Rosetta Bloom who generously sponsors the publication in memory of Nathan Baron and Alan Bloom.

The Library Fund maintains a library containing a diverse collection of books and memorabilia and supports our education programs and publications. It houses an impressive collection of Jewish music, in particular vinyl LPs of Chazzanut and 'Jewish'-related music. A large collection of classical music was generously donated by Suzie Ehrmann, in memory of her late husband and former President Ephraim's collection.

Other activities of the Library Fund include:

- Housing of educational materials for the teaching of Hebrew, Jewish history, Jewish culture and religion as well as objects and art works of religious significance;
- Weekly Bat Mitzvah and Bar Mitzvah programs;
- Adult education programs by both Rabbi Glasman and Rabbi Nagel, held on Zoom in the past year and more recently face-to-face;

Property Report

Facilities management is an onerous role with our aging buildings. Although the Board approved the appointment of a half-time Facilities Manager, the role remained unfilled.

During the year under review the following took place (with thanks to the named individuals):

- General repairs and maintenance were undertaken regularly by our onsite groundsman **Raymond Landes** and assorted handymen.
- Quarterly cleaning of the grease trap outside the Samuel Meyers Hall (SMH) kitchen. Biannual audits of our extinguishers and emergency signage. Annual termite inspection in the SMH.
- Staff shortages have challenged our ability to appoint someone to set up *kiddushim* and on occasion people to do gate security duty for events. We are now fortunate **Charmaine Wilson** helps us out with setting up *kiddushim*. As Friday and Chagim services have now moved to the DC, Charmaine packs down the “Shule” layout in the DC and then sets up *kiddushim*.
- **Bruce Levin** and sometimes **Jeff Caser** covered security on the gate for functions and weddings.

Venue hire/tenancy continues to be a big source of revenue for the Shule:





- *Gymbaroo* in the ASC (Tue-Thu school terms)
- *Australian Friendship Circle* (each Sun and Sun-Fri during winter and summer day camp).
- *Nifla Kosher catering* in half of the ASC kitchen (Sun-Fri)
- *Alfie’s Food Co* manufacturing nut butters in the ASC kitchen storeroom area (Sun-Fri) also rent office space and storage.
- *Three Daughters Food* manufactured vegan soups in the DC kitchen (Wed-Fri) ceasing trading just days before Pesach 2023.
- *Kosher Meals on Wheels* produce meals twice a week in our kitchens and lease office space.
- Casual rentals for Bar Mitzvahs (from other Shules), Sheva Berachot, birthday parties, etc. continue with increasing regularity. The Jewish Museum brings through school groups almost daily.

Building works

- DC and Shule toilets refurbishment works will commence in the coming year thanks to a \$300,000 Federal Government grant.
- Shortly, the glass Ark doors will be replaced with stronger ones made of polycarbonate.
- Unfortunately, the annexe and sukkah renovations have not progressed according to plan. Therefore, for the second year in a row, we will rely on a temporary sukkah.

Our thanks go to David Marlow and Ronnie Figdor for their substantial assistance during the year.

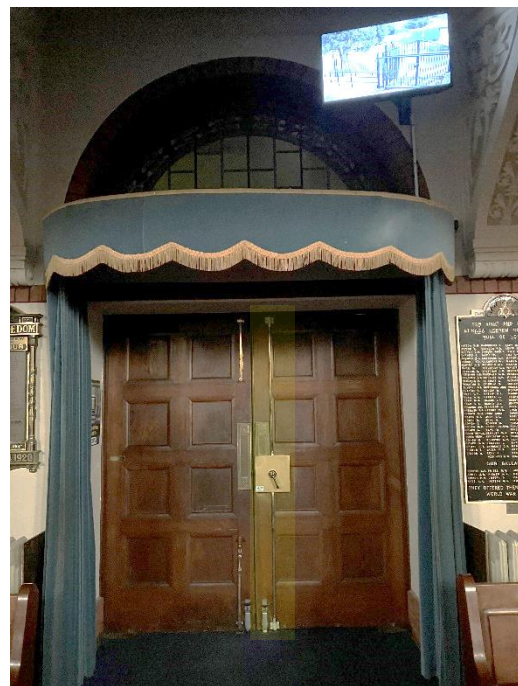
Our thanks also go to the CSG for their excellent support, and attending when issues arise during the year and sending highly trained members to assist us over Yom Tov.

Opening and Welcome

Gerry Bullon *President and Chair* declared the meeting open at 8.05pm.

The President welcomed those in attendance and in particular Board members; ministers & their spouses; Life Governors; Past Presidents; Life Members. He thanked David Marlow for recording the minutes of this AGM.

A minute's silence was held to remember all those Members who have passed since the last meeting, and those tragically killed in Israel.

Rabbi Glasman addressed the meeting and commented on:

The wonderful time we have in our Shule when we gather in person on the High Holy Days.

The cohesive joint effort of rabbinic and lay leadership.

The good reputation of our services and events.

We are kicking goals as we have member families who have strong and deep roots within our congregation.

The new member families who bring new contributions.

Thanked Rebbetzin, Gerry (150th Anniversary), Jay and all members of the congregation.

Looking forward to a meaningful High Holy Days.

The President thanked Rabbi Glasman.

1. Confirmation of the Minutes of the last Annual General Meeting (Annual Report pp. 18-19) held on Monday, 30th August 2021 (10.2(a)).

IT WAS MOVED by Anton Block AM and **SECONDED** by Carmel Bridgeman that the Minutes be confirmed as a true and correct record. There being no amendments and no discussion, The President put the motion. **CARRIED**

2. The Presentation and consideration of the Annual Report of the Board (10.2(b)) excluding the Statement of Accounts.

The President **MOVED** that the annual report, excluding the Statement of Accounts be received and adopted. **SECONDED** by Harry Pose. **CARRIED**

The President also publicly thanked Paul Topol as he attends every time that there is opportunity for us to have an historical record of an event. He is there and we are much better for his presence.

3. The presentation and consideration of the Statement of Accounts (10.2(b)).

Honorary Treasurer Jay Greenberg commented on the accounts for the past financial year, advising that it had been a very challenging year due to COVID. COVID had a profound impact and remarked on the amazing resilience of our members, who had retained their memberships through COVID. The Shule was in a strong and stable position, resulting in a virtual break-even position. The forecasts suggested a similar position for the next year, though there were some challenges ahead. He noted the increase in seat fees, which was essential to the financial wellbeing of the Shule. Significant capital expenditure was planned, thanks to the support of the State and Federal Governments.

The Treasurer noted that the Shule's capital reserve of (\$700-\$800k) had been placed with a wealth management group (Hewisons) to obtain a much-improved rate

of return, but still conservatively to protect the Shule's reserves. Hewisons had been selected by the Board through a tender process.

The Treasurer moved that the **Statement of Accounts** be received and adopted.

The Motion was **SECONDED** by Gerry Bullon Motion **CARRIED**.

4. The fourth Item on the Agenda is to approve by Special Resolution the marked-up Amendments to the By Laws of the Congregation.

Anton Block AM spoke to the proposed Amendments to the By Laws and highlighted that they modified the Shule's formal arrangements so that they better reflected the reality of operations, the creation of the positions of Wardens, the changes were derived from discussions of the Religious Committee and to help facilitate a President who cannot fulfil the full role of the President halachically.

Len Levy asked about the need for the Amendments. These were explained and understanding reached.

George Erlichster raised concern about the disappearance of the term '*Segan*'. After discussion, the motion was amended (4.5(iii)) to add the words "also historically was known as the *Segan*"

Anton Block AM moved that the Amendments to the By Laws be approved.

The Motion was **SECONDED** by Gerry Bullon Motion **CARRIED**.

5. The fifth Item on the Agenda is the election of office bearers and members of the Board (10.(c)).

(a) The Executive Director declared that the position of President was now vacant as per 9.1(b): *The President, Vice-President, and five Members must retire annually but are eligible for re-election except that no President or Vice-President may hold office in that capacity for more than two successive years (excluding any period served to fill a casual vacancy under Law 9.3) unless recommended to serve a further year to the Annual General Meeting by at least three-quarters of the total number of Board Members and particulars of such recommendation are contained in the notice required by Law 10.4.*

(b) The Executive Director has acted as Returning Officer and, in that capacity, has already advised members via *Shabbat Shalom*, of the nominations that he received by the due date. The President declared the position of President now vacant but shall continue briefly as Chairman of the meeting.

(c) The Executive Director advised, as returning officer, that “The following nominations had been received for President”: Janice Iloni-Furstenberg. The Executive Director declared Janice Iloni-Furstenberg elected President for a one-year term.

(d) The Executive Director invited the incoming President to address the meeting over Zoom. (Incoming President takes over on Shabbat Bereishit).

Janice Iloni-Furstenberg presented over Zoom from South Africa. Excerpt from her acceptance speech:

It is both an honour and a privilege to be appointed, and if I am not mistaken, as the 86th President (56th person) of St Kilda Shule and the first female President. I have been deeply touched and inspired by the generous words of congratulations, mazel tov and encouragement already. There are so many people to thank, but in particular I wish to thank Rabbi Yaakov Glasman who has been supportive from day 1, the wonderful members of the Board, staff and members of the congregation.

(e) The Executive Director, as returning officer, declared that “The following nominations had been received for Vice President”: Silviu Itescu. The Executive Director declared Silviu Itescu elected Vice President for a one-year term.

(f) The Executive Director, as returning officer, declared that “The following nominations had been received for Honorary Treasurer”: Jay Greenberg. The Executive Director declared Jay Greenberg elected Honorary Treasurer for a two-year term.

(g) The Executive Director advised that there were 7 vacancies on the Board, of which 5 are for a two-year term, and 2 for a one-year term. He further advised, as returning officer, that “The following nominations six have been received for

Board Member”: Paulette Cherny OAM, Anton Block AM, Rachelle Unreich, Tim Cohen, Melanie Super and Sam Kagan.

Executive Director declared the following Elected for a two-year term (as continuing members): Anton Block AM, Rachelle Unreich, Tim Cohen and Sam Kagan.

Executive Director declared the following Elected for a one-year term: Paulette Cherny OAM and Melanie Super

The President asked those present to join them in congratulating all those who tendered their nomination.

6. The sixth item on the agenda is the appointment of the Auditor (10.2(d)).
President called on the Honorary Treasurer. President asked was there **any discussion on the appointment** of the auditor. There was none.

The Honorary Treasurer **moved a MOTION to continue the appointment** of Loren Datt from Lowe Lippmann & partners as the Congregation’s **Auditor** for the next year. This was **SECONDED** by Gerry Bullon. **Motion CARRIED.**

7. General Business (10.2(f)).

(a) Gerry Bullon announced Selwyn Greenberg as Chatan Torah for the year and Gerald Frank as Chatan Bereishit. He also announced “with great pride” Chatanut Torah would be Carmel Bridgeman and Chatanut Bereishit, Nicole Itescu. He advised that these members were extremely deserving of their honours and he was looking forward to celebrating Simchat Torah with them and their respective families.

(b) Anton Block AM thanked Gerry Bullon for his work as President on behalf of the room. He advised that Gerry had done a fantastic job and nothing was too much trouble. Anton looked forward to continue to work with Gerry on the Board and in the choir.

The President declared the **meeting closed** at 9:00pm.

Notes to the Financial Statements

1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* and the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act (Vic) 2012*. The committee has determined that the Association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

(b) Income tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

(c) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

Property

Freehold land and buildings are valued at independent valuation.

In the periods when freehold land and buildings are not subject to an independent valuation, the management committee conduct committee's valuations to ensure the land and buildings' carrying amount is not materially different to the fair value.

Increases in the carrying amount arising on revaluation of land and buildings are credited to an asset revaluation reserve in equity. Decreases that offset previous increases of the same asset are recognised against the asset revaluation reserve in equity, all other decreases are recognised in the income statement.

Any accumulated depreciation at the date of the revaluation is eliminated against the gross carrying amount of the asset and the net amount is restated to the revalued amount of the asset.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation, except the Sefer Torahs.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including buildings, but excluding freehold land, is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

(d) Financial instruments

Investments and other financial assets are initially measured at fair value. Transaction costs are included as part of the initial measurement, except for financial assets at fair value through profit or loss. Such assets are subsequently measured at either amortised cost or fair value depending on their classification. Classification is determined based on both the business model within which such assets are held and the contractual cash flow characteristics of the financial asset unless an accounting mismatch is being avoided.

Financial assets are derecognised when the rights to receive cash flows have expired or have been transferred and the company has transferred substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership. When there is no reasonable expectation of recovering part or all of a financial asset, its carrying value is written off.

Investments

Investments includes non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments and fixed maturities where the company has the positive intention and ability to hold the financial asset to maturity. This category excludes financial assets that are held for an undefined period. Investments are carried at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method adjusted for any principal repayments. Gains and losses are recognised in profit or loss when the asset is derecognised or impaired.

Impairment of financial assets

The foundation recognises a loss allowance for expected credit losses on financial assets which are either measured at amortised cost or fair value through other comprehensive income. The measurement of the loss allowance depends upon the company's assessment at the end of each reporting period as to whether the financial instrument's credit risk has increased significantly since initial recognition, based on reasonable and supportable information that is available, without undue cost or effort to obtain.

Where there has not been a significant increase in exposure to credit risk since initial recognition, a 12-month expected credit loss allowance is estimated. This represents a portion of the asset's lifetime expected credit losses that is attributable to a default event that is possible within the next 12 months. Where a financial asset has become credit impaired or where it is determined that credit risk has increased significantly, the loss allowance is based on the asset's lifetime expected credit losses. The amount of expected credit loss recognised is measured on the basis of the probability weighted present value of anticipated cash shortfalls over the life of the instrument discounted at the original effective interest rate.

For financial assets mandatory measured at fair value through other comprehensive income, the loss allowance is recognised in other comprehensive income with a corresponding expense through profit or loss. In all other cases, the loss allowance reduces the asset's carrying value with a corresponding expense through profit or loss.

(e) Impairment of assets

At the end of each reporting period, the management committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income statement.

(f) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held on call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments.

(g) Accounts receivable and other debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

(h) Employee provisions

Provision is made for the Association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

(i) Revenue and other income

The incorporated association recognises revenue as follows:

Memberships & Security Levies

Membership and security levy revenue are recognised over time, when performance obligations have been satisfied to members.

Sale of goods

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised when the performance obligation is satisfied, generally at the time of delivery

Donations and bequests

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when the right to receive them is established and amounts can be measured reliably. Donation Income is recognised in accordance with AASB 15, if the contract is enforceable and has sufficiently specific performance obligations. Donation Income without specific performance obligations is recognised under AASB 1058

(i) Revenue and other income

Government grants

Government grants on the condition that specified services are delivered, or conditions are fulfilled, are considered reciprocal. Such grants are initially recognised as a liability and revenue is recognised as services are provided or conditions fulfilled. Revenue from non-reciprocal grants is recognised when the association obtains control of the funds.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(j) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the balance sheet.

(k) Accounts payable and other payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

2 Critical Accounting Judgments, Estimates and Assumptions

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts in the financial statements. Management continually evaluates its judgements and estimates in relation to assets, liabilities, contingent liabilities, revenue and expenses. Management bases its judgements, estimates and assumptions on historical experience and on other various factors, including expectations of future events, management believes to be reasonable under the circumstances. The resulting accounting judgements and estimates will seldom equal the related actual results. The judgements, estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities (refer to the respective notes) within the next financial year are discussed below.

Estimation of useful lives of assets

The incorporated association determines the estimated useful lives and related depreciation and amortisation charges for its property, plant and equipment and finite life intangible assets. The useful lives could change significantly as a result of technical innovations or some other event. The depreciation and amortisation charge will increase where the useful lives are less than previously estimated lives, or technically obsolete or non-strategic assets that have been abandoned or sold will be written off or written down.

Employee benefits provisions

As discussed in note 1, the liability for employee benefits expected to be settled more than 12 months from the reporting date are recognised and measured at the present value of the estimated future cash flows to be made in respect of all employees at the reporting date. In determining the present value of the liability, estimates of attrition rates and pay increases through promotion and inflation have been taken into account.
